Animal Control & Licensing

Council would like to remind residents that we have an Animal Control Bylaw. This Bylaw controls various issues relating to animals within the village, such as the number of animals you are allowed to harbor, animals running at large, defecation and creating a disturbance. Another stipulation of this Bylaw requires owners to complete an Application for License and remit an annual license fee. The annual fee for licensing your dog or cat is \$15.00 per animal if paid before April 30th. After this date the annual fee increases to \$30.00 per animal.

If you have not completed your pets Application for License form please visit our website canwood.ca to locate the application under Administration/Bylaws, Permits, Policy or obtain from the Village office. The annual fee and application can be mailed or dropped off at the office.

Recycling Cardboard/Boxes

Please remember to break down your cardboard boxes before placing in the recycling bins. Broken down boxes take up less room resulting in less tips of the bins, lowering costs to ratepayers.

Garbage Pick-up

Please be reminded of the minimum requirements for garbage pickup within the Village:

- Garbage MUST BE contained in a garbage bag with a maximum weight of 30 lbs. Small grocery bags are not considered garbage bags, thus not acceptable.
- All garbage bags must be placed in either a can with a lid or an enclosure to ensure no animals, rain water or snow accumulate on it.
- Garbage bins and enclosures must be clear and accessible. Do not pile snow or debris within close proximity so maintenance staff is able to retrieve bags easily.
- No animal or fish parts may be disposed of with household garbage.
- Boxes and paper are recyclable and not to be placed with regular garbage. It is the responsibility of the resident to take recyclables to the recycle bins on the corner Main Street and 2nd Avenue.
- Garbage must be placed for pick-up by 9 a.m.

Garbage pick-up is usually completed on Monday. If Monday is a statutory holiday, the garbage will be picked-up on Tuesday.

Drinking Water Quality and Compliance – Annual Notice to Consumers

Please be advised that the Drinking Water Quality and Compliance – Annual Notice to Consumers for 2019 is included in this mailing. This notice is also available for your viewing at the Canwood Village Office during regular office hours or on our website canwood.ca.

Insurance Coverage

I would like to encourage residents to review their insurance coverage with your insurance agent or broker to ensure you have the proper coverage. Please accept this as only a suggestion to ensure that in an emergency or unexpected event your insurance is covering the potentially high costs for repair or replacement. Items to review would be firefighting costs for charges such as call-out rates and per hour firefighter fees. These costs do not form a part of your taxes, and as such, are charged directly to the person(s) who received the service on an incident basis.

The charging of fees for Firefighting & Emergency Response Bylaw No. 2019 – 04 has set the following rates:

Fire Truck Response:

Fire Call Fee	\$300.00
Hourly Rate	\$75.00/hour after the first hour

Firefighter Response:

Minimum Call-Out	\$90.00/Firefighter
After the 3 rd hour	\$30.00/hour per Firefighter

Another item would be utility service line coverage. It currently is the resident's responsibility for any repairs to sewer lines from the main line to the residence. Residents are also responsible for water lines from the edge of their property to their residence.

The repair cost for events such as your sewer line becoming closed with a tree root, bursting or your water line rupturing, depending on your insurance company, could be covered with your home insurance.
