Payment of Taxes and Utilities

Payments can be mailed or dropped off at the office. Online payments are accepted if you bank with any Credit Union or CIBC. Please ensure you select "Canwood (VILLAGE) Taxes" or "Canwood (VILLAGE) Utilties" and use your Roll Number or Utility Account Number. Interac e-Transfer is also a method of payment. Email canwood.town@sasktel.net and utilize your Roll or Utility Account Number as the reference.

Animal Licensing

Take notice that as per Bylaw 2016 – 05, known as the Animal Control Bylaw, residents are required to annually license any dog or cat they own, possess or harbor. The license fee shall be from January 1st each year till the 31st of December of the same year. The license fees are as follows:

- Paid before April 30th \$15.00/animal;
- o Paid after May 1st \$30.00/animal.

Along with the submission of the annual license fee, you are required to submit or update Application for License form that provides details on your animal.

If you have not completed your pets Application for License form please visit our website to locate the application under Administration/Bylaws, Permits, Policy or obtain from the Village office. The annual fee and application can be mailed or dropped off at the village office.

Development & Building Permits

Property owners are required under Building Bylaw No. 2005 – 06, to obtain a Building Permit to erect, place, alter or commence construction on your property.

What is a Building Permit?

A Building Permit is a licence which grants legal permission to start construction or alteration of a building. Permits allow for the enforcement of national building codes, standards and bylaws which have been adopted by the local, provincial or federal governing bodies. The enforcement of the building code, standards and bylaws are carried out to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. The governing body which enforces the code is acting to ensure safe construction.

Why a Building Permit?

A Building Permit provides the means for Building Officials to protect the public by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction. Building Permits help the public understand what local, provincial or federal laws are in relation to the construction of any kind. Additionally, it provides the means for the building official to inspect construction, ensure minimum standards are met and appropriate materials are used. Before any work begins application must be made and approved. If you have started construction without the permit, a stop work order may be issued. Application for Building Permits are available at the Village office or on our website.

Utility Rate Increase

Please take note that Water and Sewer Rates Bylaw No. 2021 – 03, has taken effect January 1, 2022, slightly increasing the utility rates and are reflective in this current billing.
