Canwood Rec. Board Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant Program

Please be advised that the Project Report Forms for projects/programs that occurred from April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2024, should be submitted to either the Village of Canwood or R.M. of Canwood municipal office along with receipts by April 30, 2023.

This community grant program, facilitated by the Canwood Recreation Board, provides funding to non-profit volunteer organizations that support access to sport, culture and recreation program activities for the village and surrounding area people.

Payment of Taxes and Utilities

Payments can be mailed or dropped off at the office. Online or Telebanking payments are accepted if you deal with any Credit Union or CIBC. Please ensure you select "Canwood (VILLAGE) Taxes" or "Canwood (VILLAGE) Utilities" and use your Roll Number or Utility Account Number. Interac e-Transfer is another method of payment. Email: canwood.town@sasktel.net and utilize your Roll Number, Utility Account Number or the invoice number as the reference or message.

Animal Licensing

Take notice that as per Bylaw 2016 – 05, known as the Animal Control Bylaw, residents are required to annually license any dog or cat they own, possess or harbor. The license fee shall be from January 1st each year till the 31st of December of the same year. The license fees are as follows:

- Paid before April 30th
\$15.00/animal;
- Paid after May 1st \$30.00/animal.

Along with the submission of the annual license fee, you are required to submit or update Application for License form that provides details on your animal.

If you have not completed your pets Application for License form please visit our website to locate the application under Administration/Bylaws, Permits, Policy or obtain from the Village office. The annual fee and application can be mailed or dropped off at the village office.

Drinking Water Quality and Compliance – Annual Notice to Consumers

Please be advised that the Drinking Water Quality and Compliance – Annual Notice to Consumers for 2022. This notice is available for your viewing on the Village website under ‘Updates and Notices’ then go to ‘Water and Sewer’. From here you can view the many reports such as water quality sample test results, water quality index and inspection reports. If you required more information on water quality and sampling submission, please contact the office.

Garbage Pick-up

Please be reminded of the minimum requirements for garbage pickup within the Village:

- Garbage must be bagged with a **maximum** weight of 30 lbs. Grocery bags are not considered garbage bags, thus not acceptable. Additionally, please be aware that multiple smaller bags of items, such as cat litter, in a larger garbage bag can be very heavy causing the bag to break when lifted.
- All garbage must be sealed in a proper garbage bag and placed at your curb or alley in a can or enclosure with a lid to ensure no birds, animals, rain or snow can fall or accumulate on it.
- No animal or fish parts may be disposed of with household garbage.
- Boxes and paper are not to be placed with regular garbage. It is the responsibility of the resident to dispose of recyclables in the recycle bins located on the corner of Main Street and 2nd Avenue.
- Garbage must be placed for pick-up by 9 a.m. on Wednesdays.

If the above minimum requirements are not meet, please be advised that your garbage will not be collected that day.
