Water Outage

There will be having a planned water shut off in the Village of Canwood on TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2014 at approximately 2:00 p.m. This is required to repair three of the valves on our water mains. The water will be shut off until early evening. If the repairs take longer than anticipated, the water may be off until early morning of Wednesday, September 15, 2014. There may be intermittent water service during this time (in between fixing each valve), however that will only be temporary so please plan accordingly. This shut off will affect the entire Village of Canwood.

As this will cause a system depressurization, a boil water advisory will be issued at this time. It will remain in effect until the order can be lifted, which may not be until the following Monday, September 22, 2014.

Hydrant Flushing

Please be advised that at some point in the next two months, the Village may be doing some hydrant flushing. This may cause your water to appear dirty or muddy. This is just a temporary issue as the flushing stirs up sediments in the water pipes. Run your taps to clear your lines in your house.

Water & Sewer Rate Increases

As mentioned in the April, 2014 newsletter, Water & Sewer Rates will be increasing as of September 1, 2014 (will be reflected on the November 1 billing). The rates for residential properties from September 1 to December 31, 2014 will be \$60.00 per month (\$25.00 Water, \$25.00 Sewer, \$10.00 Infrastructure Service Charge). As of January 1, 2014 the residential property rate will be \$65.00 per month (\$27.50 Water, \$27.50 Sewer, \$10.00 Infrastructure Service Charge). Building Permits and You

Just a reminder to all residents and property owners, you are required to obtain a building permit for any construction on your property. If you have started construction without the permit, a "Stop Work" Order may be issued. Building permits are available at the Village Office or on our website at canwood.ca.

What is a Building Permit?

A Building Permit is a licence which grants legal permission to start construction of a building. Permits allow the enforcement of codes, standards and bylaws which have been adopted by the local or provincial governing body. The enforcement of the building code, standards and bylaws is carried out to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. The governing body which enforces the code is acting to assure safe construction.

Why a Building Permit?

A Building Permit provides the means for building officials to protect the public by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction and is therefore ensuring public health, safety and welfare. A Building Permit helps the public understand what the local or provincial laws are in relation to the construction of a building. Before any construction or any remodelling work begins applications for a permit should be made. The building permit provides the means for the building official to inspect construction, ensure minimum standards are met and appropriate materials are used.

CAFT Pre-Authorized Payments

Worried about forgetting to pay your water bill? Want to set up paying your taxes in monthly installments? The Village of Canwood is now able to offer preauthorized payments for utility bills and taxes!
