Healthy Homemade Popsicles



Enjoy these refreshing homemade popsicles! 🏓

Materials: paper cups and wooden popsicle sticks OR popsicle freezer moulds.

Ingredients: 1 cup milk, 1/2 cup apple juice, 1 cup berries (any combination such as blueberries, raspberries, or sliced strawberries), 1 ripe banana, 1 cup crushed ice

Directions: 1. Blend all ingredients together to make a fruit puree. Use enough liquid so that the mixture is very smooth. 2. Pour the mix in paper cups, about 2/3 full. 3. Place a popsicle stick in the cup. 4. Wait until frozen and dip cup in water to remove the popsicle. **If you prefer, you can strain out the seeds.** Use your favorite combination of any type of fruits!!
