WELCOME BACK REMINDERS

<u>School Parking Lot-Student Safety</u> - Keeping students safe is a priority and we are asking for your assistance. After school, please do not pull out of the student parking lot until the buses have left. Children may be walking between and/or behind parked cars on the way to their parent's vehicle where they can't easily be seen. If you need to leave before the buses, please park across the street in front of the houses. We need to do everything we can to avoid accidents, therefore, there will be teachers supervis-



ing this area while the buses are loading. If you attempt to pull away before the buses have left you will be asked to wait. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us to provide a safe environment for our students.

**A reminder to all high school students: Please park your vehicles behind the power pole in our schoolyard, as it is hard for our buses to go around each other safely.

School Bus Safety

- *Don't let children arrive at the bus stop too early. They may be tempted to wander or get into mischief. Make sure they come straight home—no detours.
- *Make sure children know what to do if they miss the bus: come back home; or if at school, report to a teacher—and **NEVER** accept a ride from a stranger.
- *If the stop is a long way from home, plan and discuss with your children where they can go in an emergency.
- *If it is dark on the way to and from the bus, make sure the children wear reflective clothing and they are visible
- *Make sure that the children wait well away from the road-way, and stay well back until the bus has come to a full stop and the door is open.
- *Explain to children they must walk at least 3 meters away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them.
- *Parents and motorists—watch for the red flashing signals and stop arm on the school bus. YOU MUST STOP.



Children, please follow these safety tips to make your school bus ride more enjoyable and safe for everyone on the bus:

- *Make sure the driver can always see you when you enter or exit the bus
- *Wait quietly in line—do not push or shove to get onto the bus
- *Don't throw things while on the bus
- *Don't yell or shout while riding the bus. Remain in your seat at all times.
- *Look both ways before you cross the street.

**A reminder to all students: If you are not going to be on your bus in the morning please call your bus driver and let them know the night before. If you are not able to contact the driver, call the place of pickup before yourself and ask them to tell the bus driver.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 1. Obey the driver promptly
- 2. Avoid any unnecessary conversation with the driver while the bus is in motion.
- 3. Respect the driver and fellow passengers.
- 4. Arrive 5 minutes before the scheduled pick up time and stand away from the roadway while waiting for the school bus.
- 5. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before moving to get on.
- 6. Always cross the road at the intersection or designated cross walk.
- 7. Always keep a safe distance around the school bus (about 3 metres).
- 8. Go directly to your seat; allow others to sit with you. Remain seated.
- 9. Sit facing forward, with your belongings on your lap or under the seat. **Keep the aisle clear**.
- 10. Obtain approval of the driver to open windows or emergency door. Nothing must hang out or be thrown out of the window of the bus.
- 11. Talk quietly. Silence is required when approaching a railway crossing.
- 12. Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus. Use of tobacco is forbidden.
- 13. Neither pets nor large objects are allowed on the bus.
- 14. Anyone who intentionally damages the bus will be held responsible.
- 15. Dress according to weather conditions. For safety reasons, avoid drawstrings or loose objects on clothing and backpacks.

Pupil transportation is a privilege – follow the rules

Violation may result in disciplinary action and possible loss of transportation.



<u>Cell Phones</u> - Students are not to have their cell phones on during class. Students in grade 7-12 are allowed to have them on in between classes, at recess and during the noon hour. If a cell phone is taken away:

1st time—it will be brought to the office

2nd time—brought to the office and phone call home

3rd time—either it stays at the office for 3 school days or a parent/guardian comes and picks it up. If you need to contact your child on their cell phone, please contact them during the times when they are allowed to have them on. If it is an emergency, you can call the school office at anytime.

<u>Noon Hour</u> - The school policy regarding students leaving the school premises at noon hour is as follows:

- *K-6 students are not permitted to leave at all. If there are exceptional circumstances, we must receive a letter or phone call from a parent/quardian.
- *7-9 students will be permitted to leave unless we get a letter from a parent/guardian stating they are not allowed to leave. 10-12 students are permitted to leave but are not allowed to drive unless they have written permission.

<u>Student Attendance</u> - Please call the school to inform us if your child will be absent or late. Also, if you pick your child up at school, please sign them out at the office before leaving.

Regular attendance is important for your child's academic success. Please try to schedule appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.

If your child is late or absent and we have not received a phone call, we will be calling you to check on your child.

PARENT & CAREGIVER INFORMATION

<u>Allergen Awareness</u> - We have been a nut-free school for several years. This year our signage will change to *Be Allergen Aware: Reduce the Risks*. This encompasses more of the allergens that are common in foods. When in doubt when preparing lunches and snacks for your child, please click on the Anaphylaxis Information under the Safe Schools heading on the Sask Rivers Website, www.srsd119.ca. If you have any questions or require further information, please contact the school. Thank you in advance for careful attention in this area.

<u>Website</u> - The Saskatchewan Rivers website, <u>Parent Information tab</u> provides valuable information on Assessment and Reporting, School Calendars and Safe Schools. As curriculums change and we use a standards base assessment, we will change how we do things. Starting in the 2015-2016 school year, we will no longer be calculating honor roll as it does not match up with the standards base assessment. Please visit the website at www.srsd119.ca.

From the Sask Rivers website you can go to the Canwood Public School website where you will find bus updates, contact information, current handbook, newsletters and staff lists. Add the Canwood School website to your favorites or your home screen to quickly check the calendar, announcements for upcoming events and noon meals.

<u>Transportation Consent</u> - We ask all parents to please be diligent in completing the new required transportation consent forms. No child will be transported to any activity without these forms being completed.

<u>Milk Program</u> - The Milk Program will be back the first week in September. Coupons will be sold in groups of 10. Small vico/milk will be 85° each (10 coupons for \$8.50) and large vico will be \$1.35 each (10 coupons for \$13.50). Cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School and cheques or cash



can be sent to the school and given to the homeroom teacher. Notes will be sent home with the student when they have used up all of their allotted coupons. A variety of activities and special draws will be held throughout the year, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Saskatchewan.

<u>Meal Cards</u> - Just a reminder that you have the option of purchasing noon meal cards and/or soup and sandwich cards. The noon meal card costs \$35.00, which is 10 meals. The soup and sandwich card costs \$20.00 - it is broken up into \$2.00 and \$1.00 squares to cover the cost of soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office.

<u>Meet the Staff BBQ</u> - Canwood Public School would like to invite the community, parents, families and students to a come and go "Meet the Staff BBQ" on Thursday, September 10 from 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m.. Terry Fox Run - Over the years, Canwood Public School has been challenged to help raise money for cancer research through the Terry Fox Run. Organizing a successful event is very rewarding for our school; and the staff, students and community have all been very supportive. By participating in the run, we remember and support those people living with cancer and those who have lost their battle. It helps to build school and community spirit, and it is a positive step toward finding the cure we need. This year, our event will be held on Wednesday, September 30 at 10:30 a.m.. Community participants, students from grades 5-12 and staff will walk from the school to the Regional Park and back. Grades 1 - 4 and anyone else wishing to walk a shorter distance will walk to Whispering Pine Place where they will meet up with the residents and then come back to the school. Following the walk, (11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.) there will be a fundraising lunch of beef/or bison stew, bun /or bannock, strawberry short-cake dessert and a drink for \$6.00/person with all proceeds going to the Terry Fox Foundation. 
