ADMINISTRATOR'S MESSAGE

October has been a busy month in Canwood Public School. The month has been filled with various activities involving all students K-12. The cross country running extravaganza was postponed till the spring due to the cold weather and snow. Education week was an outstanding event that demonstrated the theme "Celebrating Today, Preparing for Tomorrow". It was kicked off with a buddy breakfast that got the whole school together in the gym celebrating our students. The older students paired with the elementary students to share breakfast and then read a book together. Following the shared reading time, the students were organized into their houses and took part in a Math Challenge. <u>Book Fair Gift Certificates</u> - Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division's commitment for student achievement is "Excellence for Every Learner". One way that the students' education is impacted is by improving literacy. The Canwood School Council supports the ideal of improving literacy skills for the students in our school, and therefore, looks for different ways each year to support the school in educating our children. In the past the school council has bought a variety of textbooks and materials to enhance student learning. Again this year, the council has decided to present each student in Pre-K to Grade 6, a \$5 gift certificate to be used towards the purchase of a book at this years' book fair.

<u>Influenza Clinic</u> - Influenza vaccination is recommended for all individuals over 6 months of age each fall. People at greatest risk include preschoolers, pregnant women, individuals with a chronic health condition, people with severe obesity, residents of long-term care facilities and persons over 65 years of age. People who are in contact with any of these groups of people are encouraged to get immunized to protect those at high risk. There will be an influenza clinic at the Canwood Public School on Friday, November 4: 9:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and Wednesday, November 16: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m..

Please note: The Flumist vaccine (nasal spray) is an optional vaccine for 2-17 year old children. Parents of preschoolers can also book their children into a Baby clinic by phoning Public Health at 306-469-2505.

<u>The Saskatchewan Prevention Institute</u> - presents: "Hammered: A Sober Look at Youth & Alcohol" - a Youth Photovoice Exhibit

"Hammered" explores the impact of alcohol on Saskatchewan youth as viewed and experienced by the young people themselves. Photovoice is a technique that gives a "voice" to people whose voices are often unheard or ignored. Through powerful photographs and youth's own words, Hammered: A Sober Look at Youth and Alcohol is relevant to all generations as it looks at alcohol use in youth culture.

The presentation will be shown to all students in grades 9-12 on November 22, 2016 and will be presented by the Youth Action for Prevention Program Coordinator Róisín Unsworth. As the topic of alcohol use among youth can bring up many feelings and challenges, Kaley Christianson our School Social Worker will be on site.
