Over 600 student delegates and staff advisors from across Saskatchewan came together for three days to develop leadership skills and meet new people. ONGOING EVENTS

Dreamcatcher Project - This will be our third year in the Dream Catcher Project, a Saskatchewan Rivers School Division initiative. The focus of the project is to increase the achievement of every student in our school. This means setting a school-wide goal and having a school-based instructional coach work with staff and students to achieve it. We are happy to announce that last year 78% of our students reached the math goals that were set for them. We will continue with the same goal for the 2016-2017 school year. Our goal for this year reads: By June 2017, 100% of Canwood Public School K - 9 students will be achieving mastery or proficiency in Mathematics Literacy OR will have 50% catch up growth in mathematics literacy (students not achieving mastery or proficiency standards) OR will reach their individual benchmark level in mathematics literacy (students on individualized plans).

Our specific goal will be our focus on Mathematical Literacy, which includes Numbers, Patterns and Relations, Shape and Space as well as Statistics and Probability.

Essentially, this means that our wish is for every student at Canwood Public School to improve their math skills to proficiency at their grade level, or to improve their math skills if they are not currently at their grade level.

Our theme this year is <u>Splashing into Math</u> which was kicked off by the grade 7 and 8 class playing slip and slide softball. The grade 7 and 8's played enthusiastically even though it was windy and cold. The highlight for the Grade 1 to 6 classes was throwing water balloons or cups of water at the older students as they ran from base to base. Thank you to our Sticky Team for organizing this event. We look forward to updating you with progress on our goal as the school year unfolds.

<u>Student Attendance</u> - Please call the school to inform us if your child will be absent or late. Also, if you pick your child up at school, please come in and sign them out at the office before leaving.


Regular attendance is important for your child's academic success. Please try to schedule appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.

If your child is late or absent and we have not received a phone call, we will be calling you to check on your child.

<u>Nutrition Program</u> - This year will bring a change to our daily snack program - snacks will be provided on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. These snacks will consist of fruit, yogurt, toast or Nutrigrain bars. Morning snacks will not be provided on noon meal or soup and sandwich days (Wednesday and Friday). Since the loss of community school status two years ago, we have less money and less staff to order and make a daily snack and therefore this change is necessary.

<u>Noon Meals and Soup and Sandwich Lunch Cards</u> - We are pleased to offer the opportunity for students to purchase meal cards and/or soup and sandwich cards. The noon meal card is \$35.00, enough for 10 meals. The soup and sandwich card is \$20.00 - this covers soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office.

<u>Milk Program</u> - The Milk Program is back again this year. Coupons will be sold in groups of 10. Small milk will be 85¢ each (10 coupons for \$8.50) and large milk will be \$1.35 each (10 coupons for \$13.50). Cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School and cheques or cash can be sent to the school and given to the homeroom teacher. Notes will be sent home with the student when they have used up all of their allotted coupons. A variety of activities and special draws will be held throughout the year, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Saskatchewan.
