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Outdoor Ed 2017 - A group of rookie paddlers travelled to Kingsmere Lake on September 1 with the goal of reaching Grey Owl's cabin. Many ex-students from Canwood have made the same trip for many years. There have always been many stories from these ex-students that began with the phrase "Remember on the canoe trip......" This latest group of students from Canwood Public school will likely have some of the same stories. As there was a fire ban in effect, the nights were early. It wasn't guite the same without the crackle of the campfires, but all went well in spite of the slightly cooler nights. With the early nights, the participants awoke early, no one needed to be drug out of their tent in the morning. As well as paddling Kingsmere Lake, we went on two hikes, one to Grey Owl's cabin and the other to Sandy Beach. While some relaxed at the camp site, the anglers of the group took their canoes out to try their luck on the lake and then learned the skills of filleting and deboning their catch from Faron Anderson who accompanied the group on the canoe trip. The largest obstacle for the group was the large waves, which sidelined us for a few hours a couple of times. During these times the group made the best of it by building rafts and hammocks in the bush. There were some interesting choices of meals that included scramble cakes, fish and Kraft dinner mixture and maple dogs. The last two kilometers of the paddle in big waves was very interesting and character building. One crew fashioned a catamaran out of two canoes, two paddles, a tent fly and some man power, to sail their way to the South End destination. Some even shot the rapids rather than use the portage on the last leg of the journey. By shooting the rapids, I mean dragging the canoes and gear through the rocks in the river. <u>Taming The Tiger Is Coming To Canwood!</u> - The goal of this program is to provide children (ages 6-13) and their parents with a safe, supportive environment in which to learn how to deal with anger. Participants will learn the fundamentals of anger, how they react physically and emotionally when angry, and strategies to work through their anger in healthy ways. The parenting component provides parents with effective techniques to deal with aggressive behavior. The day will most likely run from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. on a Saturday in October. Lunch & snacks will be provided. There is no registration fee. This program is funded by Ministry of Justice - Victim Services. Mrs. Spigott, Canwood's School Social Worker will be organizing this program.

## **PARENT INFO & REMINDERS**

<u>School Doors Locked</u> - All doors except the main doors by the office will be locked at 9:30 a.m. and will remain locked for the remainder of the day. If you need to enter the school please do so through the main doors by the office.

<u>Student Arrival</u> - Please do not have students arriving at the school any earlier than 8:40 a.m..


<u>Cell Phones</u> - Please have a conversation with your child/ren about bringing cell phones or handheld gaming devices to school. We would ask that these items not be brought to school so that there is no risk of them being stolen or broken. If students are bringing handheld gaming devices, please remind them that it is their responsibility to look after these items during the day and they are not to be used during school hours. If you have special circumstances that require your K-6 child/ren to have a cell phone at school, we would ask that you call us and explain the situation so that we can communicate our proper use expectations to you and your child/ren.

<u>Parking Lot</u> - When picking up students at the end of the day, please do not leave the parking lot until the busses start leaving the school.

<u>Student</u> <u>Attendance</u> - Please call the school to inform us if your child will be absent or late. Also, if you pick your child up at school, please come in and sign them out at the office before leaving.

Regular attendance is important for your child's academic success. Please try to schedule appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.

If your child is late or absent and we have not received a phone call, we will be calling you to check on your child.



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<u>Nutrition</u> Program - Morning snacks will be provided on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Morning snacks will not be provided on noon meal or soup and sandwich days (Wednesday and Friday).

<u>Noon Meals and Soup and Sandwich Lunch Cards</u> - We are pleased to offer the opportunity for students to purchase meal cards and/or soup and sandwich cards. The noon meal card is \$35.00, enough for 10 meals, Kindergarten-Grade 4 is \$25.00. The soup and sandwich card is \$20.00 - this covers soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office.

<u>Milk Program</u> - The Milk Program is back again this year. Coupons will be sold in groups of 10. Small milk will be 85¢ each (10 coupons for \$8.50) and large milk will be \$1.35 each (10 coupons for \$13.50). Cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School and cheques or cash can be sent to the school and given to the homeroom teacher. Notes will be sent home with the student when they have used up all of their allotted coupons. Milk prize draws will be held throughout the year, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Saskatchewan.

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<u>Public Health</u> - Population and Public Health is responsible for immunizing students in grade 1, 6 and 8 to ensure their vaccinations are up to date and to follow-up when there is a case of a vaccine preventable disease in a classroom or school. To do this work, Public Health Nurses review the student's immunization record in the provincial immunization registry called Panorama. Panorama is a secure electronic health record system designed to store and record immunization related information. This confidential client information can only be accessed by authorized public health team staff, nurse practitioners and physicians across the province using secure networks. This fall Public Health Nurses will provide immunizations in the school to grade 6 students to protect them against hepatitis B, Meningococcal disease, chicken pox and human papillomavirus (HPV).
