School Bus

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 1. Obey the driver promptly
- 2. Avoid any unnecessary conversation with the driver while the bus is in motion.
- 3. Respect the driver and fellow passengers.
- 4. Arrive 5 minutes before the scheduled pick up time and stand away from the roadway while waiting for the school bus.
- 5. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before moving to get on.
- 6. Always cross the road at the intersection or designated cross walk.
- 7. Always keep a safe distance around the school bus (about 3 metres).
- 8. Go directly to your seat; allow others to sit with you. Remain seated.
- Sit facing forward, with your belongings on your lap or under the seat.
 Keep the aisle clear.
- 10.Obtain approval of the driver to open windows or emergency door. Nothing must hang out or be thrown out of the window of the bus.
- 11. Talk quietly. Silence is required when approaching a railway crossing.
- 12.Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus. Use of tobacco is forbidden.
- 13.Neither pets nor large objects are allowed on the bus.
- 14. Anyone who intentionally damages the bus will be held responsible.
- 15.Dress according to weather conditions. For safety reasons, avoid drawstrings or loose objects on clothing and backpacks.

Pupil transportation is a privilege - follow the rules

Violation may result in disciplinary action and possible loss of transportation.



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WELCOME BACK REMINDERS

<u>School Parking Lot-Student Safety</u> - Keeping students safe is a priority and we are asking for your assistance. After school, children may be walking between and/or behind parked cars on the way to their parent's vehicle where they can't easily be seen, or may be riding their bikes home after school. Wait to pull away from the school until students have made their way to their vehicles or down the street, and wait until the buses have left the parking lot. We need to do everything we can to avoid accidents, there-

fore, there will be teachers supervising this area while the buses are loading. If you attempt to pull away before the buses have left you will be asked to wait. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us to provide a safe environment for our students.

****A reminder to all high school students**: Please park your vehicles behind the power pole in our schoolyard, as it is hard for our buses to go around each other safely.

<u>School Bus Safety</u>

*Don't let children arrive at the bus stop too early. They may be tempted to wander or get into mischief. Make sure they come straight home—no detours.

*Make sure children know what to do if they miss the bus: come back home; or if at school, report to a teacher—and **NEVER** accept a ride from a stranger.

*If the stop is a long way from home, plan and discuss with your children where they can go in an emergency.

*If it is dark on the way to and from the bus, make sure the children wear reflective clothing and they are visible

*Make sure that the children wait well away from the road-way, and stay well back until the bus has come to a full stop and the door is open.

*Explain to children they must walk at least 3 meters away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them.

*Parents and motorists—watch for the red flashing signals and stop arm on the school bus. YOU MUST STOP.

Children, please follow these safety tips to make your school bus ride more enjoyable and safe for everyone on the bus:

*Make sure the driver can always see you when you enter or exit the bus

*Wait quietly in line—do not push or shove to get onto the bus

*Don't throw things while on the bus

*Don't yell or shout while riding the bus. Remain in your seat at all times.

*Look both ways before you cross the street.

****A reminder to all students**: If you are not going to be on your bus in the morning please call your bus driver and let them know the night before. If you are not able to contact the driver, call the place of pickup before yourself and ask them to tell the bus driver.

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<u>Noon Hour</u> - The school policy regarding students leaving the school premises at noon hour:

*K-6 students living out-of-town are not permitted to leave at all. If there are exceptional circumstances, we must receive a letter or phone call from a parent/guardian.

*Grade 7-9 students will be permitted to leave unless we get a letter from a parent/guardian stating they are not allowed to leave. Grade 10-12 students are permitted to leave but are not allowed to drive unless we have received written permission or a phone call from a parent.

<u>Student</u> <u>Attendance</u> - Please call the school to inform us if your child will be absent or late. Also, if you pick your child up at school, please come in and sign them out at the office before leaving. Regular attendance is important for your child's academic success. Please try to schedule appoint-

ments outside of school hours whenever possible.

If your child is late or absent and we have not received a phone call, we will be calling you to check on your child.

<u>Allergen Awareness</u> - We have been a nut-free school for several years. Our signage has changed to *Be Allergen Aware: Reduce the Risks.* This encompasses more of the allergens that are common in foods. When in doubt when preparing lunches and snacks for your child, please click on the Anaphylaxis Information under the Safe Schools heading on the Sask Rivers Website, www.srsd119.ca. If you have any questions or require further information, please contact the school. Thank you in advance for careful attention in this area.

<u>**Transportation**</u> Consent</u> - We ask all parents to please be diligent in completing the transportation consent forms sent home with students. No child will be transported to any activity without these forms being completed.

<u>Meal Cards</u> - You have the option of purchasing noon meal cards and/or soup and sandwich cards. For Grade 5-12 students the noon meal card (for Wednesday meals) costs \$35.00, which is 10 meals, PreK -Grade 4 costs \$25.00. The soup and sandwich card (for Friday meals) costs \$20.00 - it is broken up into \$2.00 and \$1.00 squares to cover the cost of soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office, cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School.

<u>Milk</u> Program - Milk cards will be sold for the small milk cartons, \$10.00 for 10 milk. Students with



cards are asked every day at noon whether they want a milk that day or not. A notification will be sent home with the student when they have used up their card. Milk prize draws will be held throughout the year, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Saskatchewan. Cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School and cheques or cash can be handed in to the office or given to the homeroom teacher.



Dear Parents/Guardians,

At **Canwood Public School**, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are introducing *a new, more efficient* student absence reporting system called **SafeArrival**. This new system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With **SafeArrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Use the SafeArrival website, <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-833-309-1241 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

In addition, we will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.

Please report absences in advance using **SafeArrival** instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.

Staff will be using the **SafeArrival** notifications to let you know if your student is absent (when you haven't reported the absence in advance).

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we implement this new system.

SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM

The Canwood Summer Youth Program had a great run again for the summer of 2019. With seven themed weeks and over fifty kids, ages 5-12, registered in the program, both the kids and Coordinators had a blast. This year's themes for the program were Hello Summer, Blast from the Past, SYP's Game of Games, Water Whiz, Home on the Range, Sports Extravaganza and The Great Outdoors.

For 'Hello Summer' each day had a different theme. The days included Make Something Monday, Taste Something Tuesday, Wonder Something Wednesday, Thoughtful Thursday, and Friendship Friday. Each day had a specific craft and activity based on its theme, for example, on Thoughtful Thursday, the kids made summer greeting cards for the residents at Whispering Pine Place Nursing Home. This busy week was a great start to the summer for the kids.

In 'Blast from the Past' week, the kids were transported back through time to the Ice Age, Prehistoric Times, Ancient Egypt and all the way to the '50s. The kids went on several field trips this, those of which included BINGO with the Canwood Elks, crafts and sing-a-longs with the Whispering Pine Place Residents and playing Lego and testing out 3D pens at the Canwood Public Library. This week was very busy, and there was never a dull moment at SYP.

For 'SYP's Game of Games' the kids spent each day as a themed activity or board game. For Festival day, the kids went through a giant obstacle course, where the 3 fastest participants won a prize. During Search & Find day, the kids and coordinators played several versions of Hide & Seek. On the Board day was very exciting, the kids got to try out a giant board game. During one of the days this week, we teamed up with the ladies at the Shellbrook Playground Program and headed to the Theatre for a movie and popcorn. We also took a quick trip to the Library in Canwood where the kids played with virtual reality goggles. This was a never before themed week at SYP, and I have to say that we might be doing it again in the future.

As part of our 'Water Whiz' week, the program made a trip to the Shellbrook Pool for a picnic lunch and a full afternoon of swimming. We also had a Slip & Slide at the school and water fights and activities. A massive hit with the kids during this week was making a trip to the Fire Station in Canwood. Here the kids got to wear a helmet and rubber boots and tackle a small obstacle course before firing the big water hose. Although the weather didn't quite hold up for the last couple days of the week, the kids still had a blast on the days in which we could go outside and have a water fight/water games.

During 'Home on the Range' week the kids got to travel to the Saskatoon Forestry Farm and Zoo, the Christiansen Family Farm and the Wreford Family Farm. The Saskatoon Trip was loads of fun, and the kids had such a blast seeing all the animals there. Our trip to the Christiansen Farm was another one for the books, the kids got to see and feed the Bison and even taste some pemmican. At the Wreford Farm, the kids got to feed the Beef Cows in the pasture, as well as hand feed grain to the horse.

'Sports Extravaganza' was another fun-filled week. Here the kids made many crafts and went on another week filled with field trips. We started off the week by heading to the Library in Canwood and played with Ozobots and Mice Robots. Next, the kids got to play Mini-golf in Canwood and Bowl at the Canwood Bowling Alley. We then traveled to the Affinity Credit Union in Shellbrook where the kids got to see the vault and the board room. The last field trip we took this week was to Whispering Pine Place, the kids made a fun craft with the residents and handed out their greeting cards.
