SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER - KALEY SPIGOTT

My name is Mrs. Spigott, this is my sixth year as the School Social Worker in Canwood. I have a 2 year old son and live in Prince Albert with my husband and our two dogs. We love to be outside, go to the lake, go for walks and I especially love DIY projects!

As the School Social Worker, my job is to provide school-based intervention services to assist students and their families. I provide short-term counselling and short-term case management services for students who are experiencing social, emotional and/or behavioural problems. I initiate referrals to human services agencies and with permission, can be the connection between these agencies, the family and the school community.

School Social Workers are people who students can turn to when they need some help. If you are interested in accessing School Social Worker support you can give me a call and fill out a consent form. I love working with students and am happy to support students and their families navigate some of life's most difficult challenges.

A few examples of how we can help is:

If you are struggling in math and need some extra help

If you are new to the school and do not have friends yet

If you feel you are being bullied at school

If you are upset about a family problem, such as divorce or death of a loved one

If you are having trouble concentrating on homework

If you are having friendship troubles and MUCH more...

<u>National Day of Truth and Reconciliation/ Orange Shirt Day</u> - Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

Thank you to all of our staff and students who wore orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools. We had a school wide assembly to raise awareness of the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation and to explain the concept of "Every Child Matters". We are all working together to achieve the same goal. Our children are the future leaders!

Thank you to Mrs. Hladun for making the beautiful quilt panel pictured below. We will be hanging this in the foyer of our school. As we gathered for our Day of Truth and Reconciliation Assembly, Mrs. Hladun's class walked through the halls carrying it for all to see. It is a true symbol of reconciliation as we move into the future with the Educational Calls to Action recommended from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

The Quilt panel is called The Journey Home created by Karen Erickson

"In light of the recent traumatic events that have unfolded at former Residential Schools across Canada, Karen Erickson created "Every Child Matters" out of reverence to those grieving. This painting depicts two siblings who were finally set free after being grimly discovered at a Residential School. The children who are shown holding hands were torn apart from each other, but now reunited as they make their way back home. Karen included beautiful imagery such as a moon and feathers to represent the First Nations, Inuit and Metis people joining together to guide the two siblings." 100% of the net proceeds from the sales of this quilt panel will be donated to the Indian Residential School Survivors Society and the Orange Shirt Society.

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


