ADMINISTRATOR'S MESSAGE

We were all at the edge of our seats watching their tricks and we had some volunteers from our school who went on stage to take part in the performance.

Outcomes Based Learning: Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division implemented outcomes based learning in the 2015-16 school year. This was in response to the Ministry of Education's redesign of curriculum from objectives to outcomes based learning. Outcomes define the learning expectations, what students should be able to do and understand, by the end of a course. For the most part, teachers introduce the outcomes through units of study and determine a time period for students to learn an outcome or set of outcomes based on how much time they think their students need to learn those outcomes. Students will be asked to demonstrate their learning by completing tasks and explaining their understanding. Teachers assess the level of students understandings by examining students work, having conversations with students and observing their in-class contributions. When students complete the outcome(s) they are done and they move onto the next set of outcomes to learn. There is no need for a "final" exam because the learning outcomes have been learned and assessed. The course is completed when the outcomes have been taught and time has been given to students to demonstrate their learning. In an outcomes based learning system, it is more important that students attend and engage in the day to day learning that their teachers have organized. It is for this reason, that Canwood Public School, will be ending the practice of a 'finals week' for Grades 10-12. Students will use class time to demonstrate evidence of learning for the final set of outcomes that they are completing. Please support your child by ensuring regular attendance and the completion of any outstanding work. As stated earlier, teachers need to observe and listen to students explain their learning to accurately assess a student's understanding of the learning outcomes. Regular attendance and participation in class activities is so important to their success.

You may hear of other schools needing to schedule a provincial exam. This may seem confusing to you. Schools that do not have accredited teachers may have to schedule a <u>provincial exam</u>. We are very fortunate at Canwood Public School that all of our teachers are accredited so there is no need to schedule provincial exams.

The School Community Council would like to voice our collective concerns with the Saskatchewan Rivers School Division and the Government of Saskatchewan. We feel that our voice will be louder if we have parents and caregivers involved by sharing specific and personal stories outlining the negative effects that result from a lack of student support.

Edsby has an introductory video that parents can watch - you can find it under the "support" link and then by clicking "parents". Edsby has a free app for all iOS and Android smartphones so that you can access school information or enter absences anywhere, anytime. Parents/guardians who have not connected to Edsby yet have been emailed "Invitations to Edsby" periodically over the school year. Please call the school office for more information.

<u>School Cash Online</u> - We are asking parents and guardians to sign up for School Cash Online. Currently, school fees can be paid online as well as milk cards for the elementary students. More events and items will be added to School Cash Online as they occur and become available. If you have already paid for school fees or milk cards, sign up anyway and take a look at your payment history. Payments through this program are by credit card or electronic check which is a transfer directly out of your bank account. See the next page for how to register.

How to register

1. Go to https://srsd119.schoolcashonline.com and click **Register**.

- a. Type your first name, last name, and email address, and create a password.
- b. Select a security question.
- c. Select YES to receive email notifications. You will not receive any marketing emails. Selecting YES enables the system to send you fee notifications.
- SchoolCash Online will send you a confirmation email. If you don't receive it, check your Spam folder.
- 3. Use your email address and password to log in.

How to add students to your account

- Sign in to SchoolCash Online: https://srsd119.schoolcashonline.com
- 2. At the top of the page, navigate to MY ACCOUNT.
- 3. From the dropdown menu, select My Students.
- 4. Click to add a student:
 - a. Type in your School Board Name.
 - b. Select your school name from the list.
 - c. Enter student details. The system is fully secure, with PCI certification.
 - d. Click Confirm.

You may add up to eight students on your profile.

How to make a payment

- 1. You will be able to view any available items attached to your students that are set up on your account.
- 2. Select the item which you would like to purchase and click "Add to Cart."
- 3. Once you have finished adding items to your cart, select "Check Out" to make a payment.
