## **UPCOMING EVENTS**

<u>Firearm Safety/Hunter Education Course</u> - A Hunter Safety course will be held on January 11 & 12, 18 & 19 and 25 & 26 at Canwood Community School. The course runs 3 weekends from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. each day.

The course is open to students 12 years of age as of Jan. 1/2014 to adult. A fee of \$80.00/student is due in advance. The fee covers: Provincial Hunter Education Course, Canada Firearm Safety Course, and travel for the instructor.

Canada Firearm Safety can be tested at 12 years old. It is a one time testing and students can apply for their certificate once they turn 16. Adults that have a POL (Possession Only Licence) can apply for a PAL (Possession Acquisition Licence) after the course.

Parents/guardians are welcome to come with their children, so they can see what they are learning in this class. Students will be responsible for their own lunch.

Registration forms are available at the school. Please complete on or before December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013 along with a cheque made payable to Canwood Community School for \$80.00. We must know if we have enough (at least 10) registrants by this date. If we do not, cheques will be returned.

<u>Keep Your Noggin Safe When You Toboggan</u> - Tobogganing with friends and family is an affordable, fun way to be active in the winter. Children between the ages of five and nine, account for 40 per cent of all sledding related injuries in Canada. Over 20 per cent of these injuries involve concussions, internal injuries or broken bones. (Statistics: Canadian Hospital's Injury Reporting Prevention Program). Most injuries are caused by colliding with an object (e.g., trees/rocks/signs) or from being thrown from the sled.

#### Tips for safe tobogganing:

Dress in layers. Wear a CSA certified multiple impact helmet (i.e. ski helmet or hockey helmet). Choose a hill away from road-ways, trees and rocky areas.

Sit facing forward so you can see any hazards. Remember to tuck in any strings or scarves that may get tangled or caught.


-Cook and deliver healthy ready-to-eat meals to busy family and friends or to elderly family members who may have trouble making their own healthy meals.
