Sargent, Kent Ashworth, from the Shellbrook RCMP would like to offer a few words to village residents:

“In the wake of recent break and enters and thefts in the community of Canwood, the Shellbrook RCMP would like to remind the public to report all suspicious activity. If you see a suspicious vehicle or suspicious person(s) please call 911 or 310-RCMP (7267) to get police response.”

Please note that some crimes are “crimes of opportunity” and may have been avoided by locking your vehicle, garage and shed doors. We encourage residents to call if they see suspicious activities as soon as possible and not a few hours after or the next day. Try to get as much details as possible and write them down if needed so you can relay the correct information. NEVER interfere or try and apprehend a suspicious person or persons!

Clean-up Day

The Village of Canwood will be once again having a “Clean-Up” day where we will pick up any items you wish to have hauled to the landfill. Items can be such things as old furniture, metal, wood scraps, appliances and other items you may have that are not regular household garbage.

The Village will also continue with the twist of a “Swap” day, as one person’s junk is another person’s treasure. The swap day will start Tuesday, May 16. Anything that is placed on your curb that day is free for anyone else to pick up as their treasure. Starting after lunch on the Wednesday, May 17 the remaining items will be picked-up and taken to the landfill.

This will be a FREE event for the residents of the Village with the exception of tires (fee will be based on size) and refrigerators or large appliances (\$25.00 freon disposal fee). If you require assistance with these larger items, please contact that Village office.

Please place all items for clean-up/swap at your front curb by 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, May 16, 2017. Pick-up of items will begin on Wednesday, May 17, and continue on Thursday if needed.

1 Labourer – Maintenance Department

Duties may include:

Maintenance of municipal property in the village and cemetery, street repairs, operating and maintenance of municipal equipment, garbage collection, public relations, water and sewer operations, and various other tasks as assigned.

This position is partially funded by the Student Summer Works program; therefore, the successful applicant must be at least 15 years of age, legally entitled to work in Canada, enrolled at the time of employment at a secondary or post-secondary school or institution, and returning to full-time studies after the completion of their employment.

1 Coordinator – Summer Youth Program

The Coordinator will:

Set up and deliver the program, supervise other employees, plan and organize daily snack and craft activities with weekly themes, budget for purchases and materials, maintain accounting records, work successfully with parents, caregivers and partners in the community.

Preferred skills:

- To be in or have completed Grade 12;
- Must be continuing with their post-secondary education, preferably in education or childcare;
- Must have some experience working with youth or children;
- Aboriginal students, students with a disability or from a minority group are encouraged to apply;
- CPR and Play Leadership Training would be an asset.

2 Assistants – Summer Youth Program

- Help develop, advertise & deliver the program;
- Plan and organize daily snacks, crafts and activities with weekly themes;
- Work successfully with parents and community partners;
- Preference given to those applicants with experience in working or volunteering with youth or children;
- Play Leadership Training /First Aid/CPR would be an asset;
- Metis & aboriginal students are encouraged to apply;
- Students must be returning to school full-time in the fall.
