Swap and Clean-up Day

The Village of Canwood will be once again having a "Clean-Up" day where we will pick up any items you wish to have hauled to the landfill. Items can be such things as old furniture, metal, wood scraps, appliances and other items you may have that are not regular household garbage.

The Village will also continue with the twist of a "Swap" day, as one person's junk is another person's treasure. The swap will start after lunch on Tuesday, May 22. Anything that is placed on your curb after lunch that day is free for anyone else to pick up as their treasure. Starting on Thursday, May 24, the remaining items will be picked-up and taken to the landfill.

This will be a FREE event for the residents of the Village with some exception. Fees will be charged for items such as tires (fee will be based on size), refrigerators or freezers (freon disposal fee), and larger items such as sofas, chairs, mattresses and other large appliances. Please note that we will not pick-up construction or renovation materials.

Please contact the office if you would like to obtain a cost for a specific item or if you require assistance with these larger items.

*Please place items for clean-up/swap at your front curb after 12 noon on Tuesday, May 22, 2018.

*Pick-up of items will begin on Thursday, May 24, and continue on Friday if needed.

RCMP

Shellbrook RCMP is encouraging residents to take a proactive approach with respect to crime and report any suspicious activities or information they may have in relation to criminal activity. According to our RCMP Community Policing Report, for the months of January to March 2018, there was only 8 calls to service. This seems extremely low considering the amount of comments and complaints Councillors and the village office received during that time!

If you see a suspicious vehicle(s) or suspicious person(s) please call 911 or 310-RCMP (7267) to get police response.

Please note that some crimes are "crimes of opportunity" and may have been avoided by locking your vehicle, garage, home and shed doors. RCMP encourage residents to call if they see suspicious activities as soon as possible and not a few hours after or the next day. Try to get as much details as possible and write them down if needed so you can relay the correct information. NEVER interfere or try and apprehend a suspicious person or persons!
