Recycling is EASY! What can you do to help?

Highway 55 Waste Management Corporation offers single stream or comingled recycling service. This means no more sorting recyclables for you, making it easier to recycle. All approved recyclable material may be put in one bin. A current list of allowable material is listed below. The Village of Canwood recycling bins are located at the corner of Main Street and 2nd Avenue. Your support and cooperation will assist in diverting over 60% of household waste from our landfill.

Allowable Containers must be cleaned, rinsed and caps removed (do not bag or tie):

- Aluminum soft drink & beer cans
- Household tin cans
- Milk cartons and jugs
- Juice cartons, juice boxes and all tetra-pak containers
- Plastic soft drink & water bottles
- Household plastic containers & bottles with a #1 through #7 recycling triangle on the bottom. Containers without a triangle or a triangle without a number are not accepted

Allowable Paper Materials:

- Flattened corrugated cardboard & paperboard (i.e. empty cereal boxes, empty tissue boxes)
- Newspapers & Flyers
- Magazines, catalogues, paperback books & hardcover books with covers & spine removed
- Telephone books
- Letter quality paper
- Brown paper bags, paper egg cartons, gift paper
- Shredded paper (please bag & tie)

Plastic film products such as grocery bags & plastic packaging wrap some paper products (i.e. napkins), pallet wrap and food storage bags are NO LONGER ACCEPTED

Recycling continued...

On occasions, garbage waste has been placed in these bins resulting in the contamination of the entire recycling load. Please note that glass containers or jars may not be put in these bins.

Bagged recycling must be in <u>CLEAR PLASTIC</u> <u>BAGS</u>. Any recycling bags received where the contents are not visible (in a black or coloured bag) will be moved directly into the landfill pit.

Insurance Coverage

I would like to encourage residents to review their insurance coverage with your insurance agent or broker to ensure you have the proper coverage. Please accept this as only a suggestion to ensure that in an emergency or unexpected event your insurance is covering the potentially high costs for repair or replacement. Items to review would be firefighting costs for charges such as call-out rates and per hour firefighter fees. These costs do not form a part of your taxes, and as such, are charged on an incident basis to the resident.

Another item would be service line coverage. It is the resident's responsibility for any repairs of sewer lines from the main line to the residence. Residents are also responsible for water lines from the edge of their property to their residence.

The repair cost for events such as your sewer line becoming closed with a tree root, bursting or your water line rupturing, depending on your insurance company, could be covered with your home insurance.
