### **INCLEMENT WEATHER-BUSING NEWS**

Now that we are feeling the winter weather, we would like to make sure all parents are aware of our Cold/Inclement Weather Procedures. These procedures are in affect for both rural and urban bus routes.

The Transportation Office has two methods of communicating delays or cancellations of our buses:

- CKBI and CJVR radio stations receive all notifications, these stations will announce a list of our buses that are delayed or not running.
- Notifications will be placed on our website, www.srsd119.ca.

We do not phone individual homes to report bus cancellations.

We ask that you do not call the Transportation Office as we will be very busy managing the routes and ensuring the safety of the children on the buses.

# Dressed for the season:

Students must dress appropriately for the weather. They must be dressed adequately for a 1 kilometre walk in case of an emergency. Our bus drivers have the authority to warn/educate a student on a first offense, and refuse transportation on the second.

Children and youth should **never** give out **personal information** or agree to meet someone without the parent's knowledge and consent. A screen name should never give out personal information such as name, age, year of graduation, year of birth, location or school. It is always a good idea for parents to receive additional computer training.

Have a dance party after supper.


Help clean up after dinner. Hand wash the dishes instead of using the dishwasher.
