School Bus

SAFETY GUIDELINES

1. **Obey the driver** promptly
2. Avoid any unnecessary conversation with the driver while the bus is in motion.
3. **Respect the driver and fellow passengers.**
4. Arrive 5 minutes before the scheduled pick up time and stand away from the roadway while waiting for the school bus.
5. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before moving to get on.
6. Always cross the road at the intersection or designated cross walk.
7. Always keep a safe distance around the school bus (about 3 metres).
8. Go directly to your seat; allow others to sit with you. Remain seated.
9. Sit facing forward, with your belongings on your lap or under the seat.
Keep the aisle clear.
10. Obtain approval of the driver to open windows or emergency door.
Nothing must hang out or be thrown out of the window of the bus.
11. **Talk quietly.** Silence is required when approaching a railway crossing.
12. Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus. Use of tobacco is forbidden.
13. Neither pets nor large objects are allowed on the bus.
14. Anyone who intentionally damages the bus will be held responsible.
15. Dress according to weather conditions. For safety reasons, avoid drawstrings or loose objects on clothing and backpacks.

Pupil transportation is a privilege – follow the rules

Violation may result in disciplinary action and possible loss of transportation.

WELCOME BACK REMINDERS

School Parking Lot-Student Safety - Keeping students safe is a priority and we are asking for your assistance. After school, please do not pull out of the student parking lot until the buses have left. Children may be walking between and/or behind parked cars on the way to their parent's vehicle where they can't easily be seen. If you need to leave before the buses, please park across the street in front of the houses. We need to do everything we can to avoid accidents, therefore, there will be teachers supervising this area while the buses are loading. If you attempt to pull away before the buses have left you will be asked to wait. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us to provide a safe environment for our students.



****A reminder to all high school students:** Please park your vehicles behind the power pole in our schoolyard, as it is hard for our buses to go around each other safely.

School Bus Safety

- *Don't let children arrive at the bus stop too early. They may be tempted to wander or get into mischief. Make sure they come straight home—no detours.
- *Make sure children know what to do if they miss the bus: come back home; or if at school, report to a teacher—and **NEVER** accept a ride from a stranger.
- *If the stop is a long way from home, plan and discuss with your children where they can go in an emergency.
- *If it is dark on the way to and from the bus, make sure the children wear reflective clothing and they are visible
- *Make sure that the children wait well away from the roadway, and stay well back until the bus has come to a full stop and the door is open.
- *Explain to children they must walk at least 3 meters away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them.
- *Parents and motorists—watch for the red flashing signals and stop arm on the school bus. **YOU MUST STOP.**



Children, please follow these safety tips to make your school bus ride more enjoyable and safe for everyone on the bus:

- *Make sure the driver can always see you when you enter or exit the bus
- *Wait quietly in line—do not push or shove to get onto the bus
- *Don't throw things while on the bus
- *Don't yell or shout while riding the bus. Remain in your seat at all times.
- *Look both ways before you cross the street.

****A reminder to all students:** If you are not going to be on your bus in the morning please call your bus driver and let them know the night before. If you are not able to contact the driver, call the place of pickup before yourself and ask them to tell the bus driver.

Cell Phones - Students are not to have their cell phones on during class. Students in grade 7-12 are allowed to have them on in between classes, at recess and during the noon hour. If a cell phone is taken away:

1st time—it will be brought to the office

2nd time—brought to the office and phone call home

3rd time—either it stays at the office for 3 school days or a parent/guardian comes and picks it up.

If you need to contact your child on their cell phone, please contact them during the times when they are allowed to have them on. If it is an emergency, you can call the school office at anytime.

Noon Hour - The school policy regarding students leaving the school premises at noon hour:

*K-6 students are not permitted to leave at all. If there are exceptional circumstances, we must receive a letter or phone call from a parent/guardian.

*7-9 students will be permitted to leave unless we get a letter from a parent/guardian stating they are not allowed to leave. 10-12 students are permitted to leave but are not allowed to drive unless they have written permission.

Student Attendance - Please call the school to inform us if your child will be absent or late. Also, if you pick your child up at school, please come in and sign them out at the office before leaving.

Regular attendance is important for your child's academic success. Please try to schedule appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.

If your child is late or absent and we have not received a phone call, we will be calling you to check on your child.

PARENT & CAREGIVER INFORMATION

Allergen Awareness - We have been a nut-free school for several years. Our signage has changed to *Be Allergen Aware: Reduce the Risks*. This encompasses more of the allergens that are common in foods. When in doubt when preparing lunches and snacks for your child, please click on the Anaphylaxis Information under the Safe Schools heading on the Sask Rivers Website, www.srsd119.ca. If you have any questions or require further information, please contact the school. Thank you in advance for careful attention in this area.

Nutrition Program - This year will bring a change to our daily snack program - snacks **will be** provided on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. These snacks will consist of fruit, yogurt, toast or Nutrigrain bars. Morning snacks **will not** be provided on noon meal or soup and sandwich days (Wednesday and Friday). Since the loss of community school status two years ago, we have less money and less staff to order and make a daily snack and therefore this change is necessary.

Transportation Consent - We ask all parents to please be diligent in completing the transportation consent forms. No child will be transported to any activity without these forms being completed.

Milk Program - The Milk Program will be back the first week in September. Coupons will be sold in groups of 10. Small vico/milk will be 85¢ each (10 coupons for \$8.50) and large vico will be \$1.35 each (10 coupons for \$13.50). Cheques can be made payable to Canwood Public School and cheques or cash



can be sent to the school and given to the homeroom teacher. Notes will be sent home with the student when they have used up all of their allotted coupons. A variety of activities and special draws will be held throughout the year, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Saskatchewan.

Meal Cards - Just a reminder that you have the option of purchasing noon meal cards and/or soup and sandwich cards. The noon meal card costs \$35.00, which is 10 meals. The soup and sandwich card costs \$20.00 - it is broken up into \$2.00 and \$1.00 squares to cover the cost of soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office.

Public Health - Dear Parents/Guardians: Population and Public Health is responsible for immunizing grade 1, 6, and 8 students and also follow-up when there is a case of a vaccine-preventable disease in a classroom or in a school. To do this work, Public Health Nurses review every student's immunization record in the provincial immunization registry called Panorama. Panorama is a secure electronic health record system designed to store and record immunization-related information. This confidential client information can only be accessed by authorized public health team staff, nurse practitioners and physicians across the province using secure networks. If you have questions about Panorama visit www.ehealthsask.ca/panorama or call 306-469-2505.



This fall Public Health Nurses will provide immunizations in the school to grade 6 students to protect them against hepatitis B, meningococcal disease, chicken pox and human papillomavirus (HPV for girls only). Please complete the grade 6 immunization consent form and have your child return it to school as soon as possible. Thank you.

- Injury-related dental treatment (including future dental treatment up to age 26);

School Board Election

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 26, 2016

SASKATCHEWAN RIVERS PUBLIC SCHOOL DIVISION NO. 119

The school division is divided into ONE (1) CITY SUBDIVISION in which FIVE (5) BOARD MEMBERS are to be elected and FIVE (5) RURAL SUBDIVISIONS in which ONE (1) BOARD MEMBER from each subdivision is to be elected.

Qualifications of Candidates....

A person is eligible to be nominated as a candidate for and hold office as a BOARD MEMBER for a school division if the person:

- (a) is an voter of the school division on the day of the election;
- (b) is a Canadian citizen at the time he or she submits his or her nomination paper;
and
- (c) has resided:
 - in the school division for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper; and
 - in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he or she submitted the nomination paper.

A candidate may choose to run in the IN-CITY SUBDIVISION AREA or ONE of the FIVE OUT-OF-CITY AREAS of the school division, regardless of his or her residency in the division; however, he or she must obtain signatures of voters of only that subdivision area in which he or she intends to run.

Nomination Forms....

A person may be nominated as a candidate for election by filing a nomination paper in the prescribed form, which is to be signed by at least ten voters residing in the area of the subdivision area in which he or she intends to run.

Nomination forms may be obtained during regular office hours (8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) starting August 30, 2016 at the Education Centre, Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division No. 119, 545 – 11th Street East, Prince Albert, SK. S6V 1B1 or at www.srsd119.ca

Filing Nomination Papers....

Nominations will be received by election officials during regular office hours (8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) from September 6 until September 20 and on Nomination Day, Wednesday, the 21 day of September, 2016 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the following locations:
