

New High School Report Card

The Ministry of Education has implemented a new information system called My Schools Sask (MSS) for all school divisions in the province. As a result, our report card will look different for the 2020-2021 school year. The report card will continue to provide parents and students with a summary of the students' progress and growth with respect to subject grade level expectations or outcomes. The outcomes describe what a student is expected to know, understand and do in a subject area for their grade level. In the past, we have reported on the strands of a subject, such as reading, writing, listening, speaking and viewing. Now, we will report whether a student is beginning, approaching, meeting, or exemplary in their demonstration of learning within subject and grade specific outcomes. Grade 10-12 classes will be assigned a final grade in a percentage as we have in the past. In a few classes, you may notice that a specific outcome is not identified for the subject your child is learning. This is normal and these will be developed and added to the report card by the Ministry of Education. Our goal is to continue to ensure that parents and students understand the progress that the student is making with respect to grade level outcomes. An online parent/student portal will be coming soon. A report card should confirm all other communication that has happened between students, teachers and parents. Please talk directly with your child's teacher with any questions or concerns that you may have about your child's progress or about the report card itself. The following charts are intended to support your understanding of the language that will be used in the report card.

INCLEMENT WEATHER-BUSING NEWS

We will soon be feeling the winter weather, we would like to make sure all parents are aware of our Cold/Inclement Weather Procedures. These procedures are in effect for both rural and urban bus routes.

The Transportation Office has a few methods of communicating delays or cancellations of our buses:

- CKBI and CJVR radio stations receive all notifications, these stations will announce a list of our buses that are delayed or not running.
- -Notifications will be placed on our website, <u>www.srsd119.ca</u>. Scroll down on the home page to Transportation and you will find a "Bus Report" link. Click on the bus report to check for a list of bus cancellations.

We do not phone individual homes to report bus cancellations.

We ask that you do not call the Transportation Office as we will be very busy managing the routes and ensuring the safety of the children on the buses.

Students must dress appropriately for the weather. They must be dressed adequately for a 1 kilometre walk in case of an emergency. Our bus drivers have the authority to warn/educate a student on a first offense, and refuse transportation on the second.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

At **Canwood Public School**, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

Our **new, more efficient** student absence reporting system called **SafeArrival** is now working with our new MSS information system. **SafeArrival** reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, makes it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With **SafeArrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the **SchoolMessenger app** from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-833-309-1241 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

In addition, we will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system (automated call-out) to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.

Please try to use SafeArrival to report absences instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.

Staff will be using the **SafeArrival** notifications (automated call-out) to let you know if your student is absent (when you haven't reported the absence in advance).
