Lest we forget

November 8 is Indigenous Veterans Day

Why is there a separate Veterans Day for indigenous people?

The creation of a distinct Indigenous Veterans Day emerged from efforts to address historical oversights and provide a dedicated time to recognize the thousands of Indigenous soldiers who served in World War I, World War II and the Korean War.

During WWII, when Indigenous soldiers returned to Canada, many of them realized they had lost their Indian Status. Despite their service to the nation, their rights were taken away and they did not receive the same recognition and benefits as other counterparts.
