Grade 9 Chemical Safety & Waste Management Tours - On Tuesday, May 20 the Canwood Grade 9 Health class visited the Canwood Co-Op Agro Retail Fertilizer Plant and the Highway 55 Waste Management Facility. When the class went to the Co-Op Agro plant, Mr. Brian Wiwcharuk showed us around the buildings. While we were there we learned many new things, like the fact that farmers are given big plastic bags to put their discarded chemical jugs into. Curb stops and fence posts are made from the recycled jugs. Mr. Wiwcharuk informed us that you need a respirator if you are using harmful chemicals. Our visit was very interesting and a learning experience.



Then we went to the Highway 55 Waste Management Corporation facility. Mr. Niels Bundgaard showed us around, and then took us to the compacting machine. This facility has been operating since 2005, they are on their second pit and they hope to use it till 2015. After the cardboard is compacted, it is sent to Saskatoon and sorted there. There are six towns that use the landfill: Canwood, Shellbrook, Debden, Big River, Spiritwood, and Shell Lake. There are seven employees that work at the site. They are not all at the site, some are away collecting garbage.



This is what the Grade 9 class learned on their trip to the two facilities. We would like to thank Mr. Wiwcharuk and Mr. Bundgaard, and Mrs. Tracy Pease for using her bus to take us to these sites.

Congratulations to the entire Canwood Track and Field team and good luck to both Tara and Ryan in provincials next week in Moose Jaw!


